ANZRS AI Award for Best Conference Paper

The Australia and New Zealand Regional Science Association (ANZRS AI) will host its 41st Annual Conference on the Toowoomba campus of USQ, 6-8 December 2017. The theme this year is “Fostering Regional Resilience, Engagement and Innovation”.

At the conference, ANZRS AI will present an Award for the Best Conference Paper, sponsored by the Bureau of Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Economics. There is a small cash grant given to the winner (\$500). To be eligible for this Award, the following conditions must be met:

- An abstract for the paper is submitted on-line by 16 October 2017.
- A copy of the full paper is sent to Professor Paul Dalziel by email at paul.dalziel@lincoln.ac.nz by 3 November 2017.
- The paper is presented at the conference by one of the authors.

The winner of the 2016 ANZRS AI Award for the Best Conference Paper was Karim K. Mardaneh, Jerry Courvisanos and Ameeta Jain (Federation University and Deakin University) for their paper “Economic Resilience of Regions: A Longitudinal Study of the Australian Economy from 1986 to 2011.” This was published in the refereed proceedings, available at <http://anzrsai.org/assets/Conferences/ANZRS AI-2016-Conference-Proceedings.pdf>.
